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## LAVAN'S STUDIO APARTMENT

Located in the rundown nook of a housing scheme, this was revamped from its dilapidated state. One single space with activities separated by levels was facilitated by removing inside walls. The rear-space was cleared to create an enclosedcourtyard; the main source of light/ventilation.An antique window, a sculptural 'Dam' (Syzygium caryophyllatum) tree, and a built-in bench with niche lights ensure the sit-out's coziness. The teal-blue door, ornamental grill-gate and swirling number plate, all add a unique character.route bordering on the landscape's peripheries




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# Palinda Kannangara

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## OCULUS





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## RESIDENCE

Two key elements define conspicuously, thecharacter of this unique sub-urban house. A solid rubble wall provides the stable base upon which, a cantilevered and timber-slatted box perches comfortably. Between these two elements lie a transparent strip of glass windows, which separate the stone base from the aforesaid timber structure above it, to emphasize on the floating effect. This results in the articulation of a gravity-defying sensation.









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# **Russell Dandeniya**

This Office building was designed for a plant propagation and growing media exporter to expand its factory. On a largely sloping terrain, the plan was to retain the available flat land for future expansion. Except for foundation and retaining walls, the entire structure could be up-cycled once the facility passes its lifespan. Further, the building orientation along East-West axis ensures optimum daylight. Owing to the aforesaid and many other innovative features, it is fair to categorize this as a 'Blue Efficient' building.

## PAINTSHOP

The ordinary hardware is chaotic, incomplete and ever-changing. The intention here was to retain the aforesaid, and introduce 'organized-chaos'. 'Adaptive/expandable interior' was the concept that molded the space into a robust chamber. Brick, salvaged wooden pallets, pinewood timber counters in combination with GI pipes was the material combination utilized. GI was used as annadjustable structural element, while pinewood andnused palettes were employed for shelving. The Glpinewood centerpiece-counter serving customers offers an engaging purchasing experience.







## WAR MEMORIAL

On arrival, horrors of war is portrayed in the form of an 'entrance pavilion'; gunfire-battered on the outside,but serene within. The visitor are led through a long well-orchestrated contemplative journey of sadness and remembrance. Two earth mounds depict two worlds; 'ours', and the 'other' after life. The white 'tomb' stands atop the latter, and is venerated with flowers and candles before one enters on a pedestal. 




# **Damith Premathilake**



















# Nalaka Krishantha
